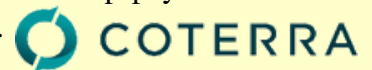

Horticulture students Chase Witmer, Mingkhwan Phiset, Cale Rice, and Olivia Smith traveled to Indianapolis with instructor Curtis Runyan for the National (FFA) Convention & Expo. The team completed written and hands-on exams on nursery, greenhouse, garden center, landscape technology, plant identification, plant disorders, pest identification, and equipment and supply identification. They also produced a landscape estimation as part of the competition. Rice finished 10th garnering a Gold distinction, Phiset also earned a Gold distinction, Witmer achieved a Silver distinction, and Smith a Bronze. As a team, the group attained a ranking of 26th, securing a Silver distinction in the nation.

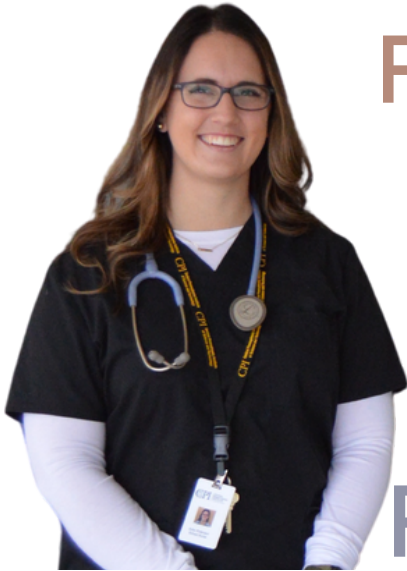

THE COMEBACK KID



FEATURING LIFELONG LEARNER ARIKA ROBINSON

It is not uncommon for CPI graduates to return as adult learners to further their education or enter a different program of study to enhance existing skills, so it is no surprise to see familiar faces entering postsecondary programs. However, few have taken a path similar to Arika Robinson, who has been a CPI student throughout different stages of her life since high school. Robinson entered the Medical Science program as a sophomore from Bald Eagle Area and later earned her Certified Nurse Assistant certification.

During her senior year, along with other advanced students, she was able to take the phlebotomy portion of the Medical Assisting program to obtain her certification as Certified Phlebotomy Technician. After high school, Robinson enrolled in and graduated from CPI's 10-month postsecondary Medical Assisting program. Shortly thereafter she became employed by Mount Nittany Physician Group in their Urology department.

After seven years at Mount Nittany, Robinson wanted a change and made an unconventional decision by taking a leave of absence to enlist in the Air Force Reserves. Military enlistment was not the unconventional part. Rather than entering training in the medical field, she chose something outside of her comfort level. Staff Sergeant Arika Robinson, who was deployed to Kuwait from July 2019 to March 2020 chose to enter the Air Transportation unit as an Air Transportation Craftsman

where she performs and manages air transportation activities. Her responsibilities include processing eligible passengers and cargo for air movement on military and commercial-contract aircraft. When asked why she chose something outside of the medical field, Robinson replied, "I chose the military because of the structure, the camaraderie, and the opportunity for travel, but I also wanted an opportunity to operate heavy equipment. This position gives me that chance, along with a break from my full-time medical career. Plus, it keeps my career experiences rounded."

It may also have something to do with her childhood experiences, which developed into a life-long dream of becoming a flight nurse. "Starting at age five, my mom and gram would read to me, I am not exactly sure what it was, but I would tell them I wanted to be a doctor," she said, "I also found that I had an interest in helicopters. Over the years I started exploring different types of nursing and medical careers such as dance therapy, physical therapy, chiropractic care, then I discovered that I could be a nurse in a helicopter and that was it!", she said. "I think it has something to do with those childhood dreams of wanting to be a superhero," she added with a laugh.

Robinson chose nursing because of her passion to help people. Stating that it brings her great joy to assist people who need help coping through their struggles, healing, and living their best lives. This past year, she left Mount Nittany for her next pit stop on the way to her dreams.

Again, Robinsons enrolled at CPI, this time as a full-time student in the Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN) program. She graduated in July 2021, now works at Juniper, a long-term care facility, and passed the National Council Licensure Examination in August of that year.

When asked what the draw is to CPI that keeps her coming back, Robinson points to two main things; the quality of the education and the staff. "I have obtained a lot of knowledge throughout my years at CPI and have been blessed with wonderful teachers. The staff are knowledgeable, friendly, and always eager to set

each student up for success.” She is also grateful as a student and young employee that CPI is geared toward helping students find employment.

“There are opportunities I don't think I would have had if I attended elsewhere”, she added. She also mentioned the cost and convenience of her education, stating that she was able to save “tons of time and money” as a CPI student versus attending a college or university. According to Robinson, she was able to further her education mostly on her own terms and the added savings allowed her to maintain her household without the need to borrow.

What is next for Robinson? Her next goal is to complete the work hours and prerequisites required to complete an LPN to Registered Nursing bridge program and is hoping that occurs at CPI should the RN program come to fruition. Although her dream job to become a flight nurse in the military remains, she said life's circumstances have made her take a longer route.

For now, she has chosen to carry the torch, “CPI students have great reputations in the medical field and I am proud to be a product of that. It is a tradition I'm glad I will be carrying it on.” When thinking about Robinson and her journey, the ending of the Robert Frost poem *The Road Not Taken* comes to mind, “Two roads diverged in a wood, and I— / I took the one less traveled by, / And that has made all the difference.” Regardless of what is in store for Robinson, she continues to make a difference in the lives of many, just as CPI has made a difference in hers. You might even say she's a hero to some. In many ways, she continues to fulfill her childhood dreams.
